White buoys with blue stripes may be purchased locally at the Oquossoc and Rangeley Marinas as well as Boss Powersports.	
Neglected, abandoned or unauthorized moorings (including but not limited to, unpaid fees, or wrong location) shall be removed under the direction of Code Enforcement. Any expense incurred will be borne by the person responsible for its placement.	
Mooring holders must attest to a self-inspection, a safe, working condition.	acknowledging that the mooring is in
Violation of any of the above rules as stipulated may result in the forfeiture of all permit and lease privileges. See Ordinance Chapter 38.12 for the Rangeley Mooring Code.
